# ARP ESSER Health and Safety Plan Guidance & Template

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Section 2001(i)(1) of the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act requires each local education agency (LEA) that receives funding under the ARP Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) Fund to develop and make publicly available on the LEA's website a *Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan*, hereinafter referred to as a *Health and Safety Plan*.

Based on ARP requirements, 90 percent of ARP ESSER funds will be distributed to school districts and charter schools based on their relative share of Title I-A funding in FY 2020-2021. **Given Federally required timelines, LEAs eligible to apply for and receive this portion of the ARP ESSER funding must submit a Health and Safety Plan that meets ARP Act requirements to the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) by Friday, July 30, 2021, regardless of when the LEA submits its ARP ESSER application.**

Each LEA must create a Health and Safety Plan that addresses how it will maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff, and which will serve as local guidelines for all instructional and non-instructional school activities during the period of the LEA's ARP ESSER grant. The Health and Safety Plan should be tailored to the unique needs of each LEA and its schools and must take into account public comment related to the development of, and subsequent revisions to, the Health and Safety Plan.

The ARP Act and U.S. Department of Education rules require Health and Safety plans include the following components:


1. How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

This Health and Safety Plan will follow a point in time philosophy meaning the district will continue to monitor guidance from the CDC and PA Department of Health for the reopening and continued maintenance of school facilities including consistent implementation of prevention strategies. In consultation with St. Luke's Health Network physicians, including epidemiologists and pediatricians, on January 4, 2022 the following decisions and recommendations have been identified:

- Maintain ongoing collaboration with St. Luke's National Health Network and CDC/PADOH officials to monitor community transmission indicators that would reflect an elevated level of risk.
  - Upon reflection of the risk level, the district will employ a system of phased prevention strategies including:
    - testing referral to a student's/staff member's primary care physician to identify, quarantine/isolate and subsequently limit transmission and outbreaks among staff and students,
    - continue the encouragement of staff vaccination either personally or through the hosting of a district site-based clinic,
    - continue the provision of information for learning community members regarding the vaccination of students either personally or through the hosting of a district site-based clinic.
  - Maintain ongoing communication regarding health and safety status and planning with the learning community including, but not limited to:
    - Optional mask wearing in district buildings
    - Mandatory mask wearing on school buses/transportation due to mandatory federal transportation regulations
    - Hand washing and respiratory hygiene
    - Social distancing to the maximum extent feasible, and
    - Cleaning, Sanitization and Ventilation.
2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

- The district has established a plan for the implementation of 1:1 technology for students and staff. This plan will allow varied instructional options in all buildings within the brick and mortar as well as synchronous remote learning, if and when the need arises.
  - Instructional delivery will be enhanced by the utilization of Schoology for grades 4-12 and SeeSaw for grades K-3 as learning management systems enabling flexibility for synchronous, asynchronous and remote learning opportunities including delivery of instruction, assignment completion, online collaboration and assessment.
  - The district has established a phased rollout plan for the dispersal of student specific devices assuring a 1:1 instructional environment in all district buildings.
  - The district continues to provide opportunities for internet access for families in need.
  - To support student and staff mental health, building school counselors are available to provide consultation and resources in the form of small group and independent services as needed. Additionally, the district licensed social worker has created a resource guide for families available in all buildings, the lobby of the Administration Building and on the district website.
  - The district will continue to partner with St. Luke’s University Health Network for the YESS! Program: *Your Emotional Strength Supported*. This program provides counseling, therapy and referral services to meet the mental and behavioral health needs of all Pleasant Valley students.
  - District faculty and staff mental health needs will be supported by the Employee Assistance Program of the Penn Foundation.
  - Food distribution services will continue with the offering of free daily breakfast and lunch services while in session.
